## Sensational Kids breaks new ground on National Child Development Centre

A SOCIAL enterprise and charity dedicated to supporting children and adolescents with additional needs has broken ground on its new national child development centre in Kildare town.

Sensational Kids' new centre aims to support over 300 children each week, providing 13,000 therapy sessions annually for children in need.

Additionally, it will equip

thousands of parents, teachers, SNAs and clinicians with the knowledge, skills and resources needed to better support the children in their care.

One in four children in Ireland has an additional need, and Sensational Kids has been a beacon of support since its founding in 2008 by Kildare woman Karen Leigh. Karen set up the enterprise



## TD's home targeted by far-right protestors

LOCAL TD James Lawless has become the latest politician to have anti-immigration protestors turn up at his home address.

Around a dozen protestors wrapped in Tricolours on Tuesday evening last to shout about various issues outside the home of the chair of the Dáil's Justice Committee and filmed themselves doing so.

Speaking with the Kildare Nationalist last week, deputy Lawless voiced some concern about giving the incident any further oxygen.

"I was out of the house on a canvass and quite a bit away when I got a call from a neighbour saying there was a gang going up my road," he said.

"I was shocked, but I kind of expected it sooner or later," he

"The mood around politics has been getting darker, to be honest, and this is happening a lot," he

"I was a bit apprehensive something like this might happen, I had an inkling," he revealed.

"The gardaí came back to me because there have been threats before, there was a man before the courts in Naas for making threats and another in Maynooth, it's unfortunate in the public eye,

"But it's an absolute minority of a minority and since then I've had an absolute flood of

support on the phone and people stopping me on the street," he revealed.

"One fellow stopped me, life-long Labour supporter, said he'd

never vote Fianna Fáil, said this was just wrong and there was no place for it," he said.

"Colleagues in the Dáil - from all sides - have come over to say 'we're all in this together'," he said. "It's a plague on politics," he

"That evening, I went out and spoke with the group and asked what's this about, saying I was readily available in clinics to talk about housing or planning issues with constituents, but most of what I got was immigrants, Covid and the World Economic Forum,' he revealed.

"They claim more support than they have and that's why the local elections are a good thing," he

"The local elections will be a very public test of their support and we'll all be watching this very closely," he said.

"If constituents have an issue. they can come and have a word in my clinics, not outside my home."
